CITY COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
NOVEMBER 13, 2017**

The Council of the City of Mexico, Missouri met in regular session on November 13, 2017 at 7:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers of City Hall, with the following members present: Mayor Chris Miller; Chairman Pro Tem Chris Williams; Council Member Steve Nichols; Council Member Ron Loesch; Council Member Dr. Ayanna Shivers. Also present were Bruce Slagle, City Manager; Roger Haynes, Deputy City Manager; Russell Runge, Assistant City Manager/Economic Development; Kensey Russell, Public Works Director; Chad Shoemaker, Parks & Recreation Director; Rita Jackson, Community Development Director; Chief Susan Rockett, Public Safety Department; Louis Leonatti, City Attorney; Drew Williford, City Civil Engineer; Patrick Shaw, IT Specialist; Marcy LeCount, City Clerk; as well as members of the media and interested citizens.

The Meeting was called to order with Mayor Miller presiding.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES – OCTOBER 23, 2017 – REGULAR SESSION MEETING

Council Member Shivers moved for approval of the October 23, 2017 regular session minutes as presented. Council Member Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Abstaining, Williams. The Minutes were approved as presented.

PUBLIC HEARING – PROPOSED RECODIFICATION OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF MEXICO, MISSOURI

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved to open the Public Hearing. Council Member Shivers seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. The Public Hearing was open.

Mayor Miller called upon City Manager Slagle to present the report.

City Manager Slagle reported that the public hearing was advertised in the Mexico Ledger to gather citizen input into the proposed recodification of the Mexico City Code. The Mexico City Code is undergoing the first major update since 1988. Recent Ordinances will be incorporated, and provisions are being brought into line with changes to Missouri State Statutes. In November of 2015 Council engaged Municipal Code Corporation of Tallahassee, Florida, to conduct a major update and reorganization of the Mexico City Code. Municipal Code Corporation is one of the top recodification firms in the nation. Recodification is essentially a careful editing of the code to bring it into line with State law, remove inconsistencies and obsolete provisions, and incorporate new ordinances passed since the code was last updated. The present version of the Code was first typed into a word processor over twenty years ago, which makes it difficult to search for particular provisions, especially for anyone who is not very familiar with the document. Therefore; the chapter structure was reorganized to make provisions easier to find and to provide room for future amendments. The first draft of the reorganized Code was presented to Staff in April 2016. Since the last update in 1988, Council adopted dozens of amendments and new ordinances and many State laws changed, which made parts of the Code obsolete. City Staff reviewed the first draft in great detail between April and November of 2016. The review period was lengthy considering the number updates and total number of pages requiring review. The second draft of the reorganized Code was received in January 2017. Staff and City Attorney reviewed and edited the second draft. The third draft was received April 2017 and upon additional review and revisions approval was given to print the final draft, which was received in July 2017. The final draft is a public document and is accessible for viewing at City Hall or on the City's website. City Council held a Work Session on September 25, 2017, to review and familiarize themselves with the updated Code. This Public Hearing allows City Council to receive public comment on the final draft. Upon direction from Council, Staff will proceed with presenting any changes directed by Council at the December 11, 2017 meeting for first reading by title only of an Ordinance adopting the new revised code.

City Manager Slagle recommended Council proceed with the advertised public hearing on the proposed recodification of the Code of the City of Mexico, Missouri.

There were no public comments.

Council Member Shivers commented on changes that are needed in various sections of the code.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams asked how the recodification was going to help enforce various codes in the community. City Manager Slagle provided information and discussion was held.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams commented on the code in various sections concerning housing permits, fishing from culverts, chicken regulations, noise ordinance and sidewalk/parkway responsibilities of the residents.

Department Directors held discussion to address Chairman Pro Tem Williams' questions.

Council Member Nichols moved to close the Public Hearing. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. The Public Hearing was closed.

OLD BUSINESS – ORDINANCE (SECOND READING BY TITLE ONLY AND PASSAGE)

Bill No. 2017 – 64. An Ordinance Amending Chapter 7, Article X, Schedule 4, One Way Streets and Alleys, of the Motor Vehicles and Traffic Schedules of the Mexico City Code.

Mayor Miller called upon City Manager Slagle to present the report.

First reading by title only was given to Bill No. 2017 – 64 on October 23, 2017. Bill No. 2017 – 64 arises from a Council concern regarding the current usage of Cauthorn Street as a two-way roadway. Cauthorn Street runs north-south between East Promenade Street and East Liberty Street. The street is 15ft wide and has one alley and one driveway that both intersect the street on its east side. A review of Cauthorn Street was conducted by the City's Engineering Department to determine if a change of use was warranted. During the review, letters were mailed to property owners on the south side of East Promenade and the north side of East Liberty Streets, east of Cauthorn Street, and the Missouri Military Academy (MMA owns a parking lot which utilizes the adjacent alley), for input in a possible change of usage for this street. Two responses were received, Missouri Military Academy and one resident along East Promenade Street, each in support of making this a one-way street. Due to the narrow roadway and limited maneuverability in the area (e.g. retaining wall on west side), the Engineering Department deems a change in use for Cauthorn Street is warranted. Since a potential sight distance restriction exists at the south end of Cauthorn Street, the City's Engineering Department is recommending that Cauthorn Street be modified to a northbound one-way street. City Manager Slagle recommended Council proceed with second reading by title only and passage of Bill No. 2017 - 64.

Council Member Loesch moved for second reading by title only of Bill No. 2017 – 64. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. First reading by title only was given to Bill No. 2017 – 64 by Council Member Loesch.

Council Member Loesch moved for passage of Bill No. 2017 – 64. Council Member Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Bill No. 2017 – 64 was passed as Ordinance 4386.

NEW BUSINESS – ORDINANCE (SECOND READING BY TITLE ONLY AND PASSAGE)

Bill No. 2017 – 65. A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager To Enter Into An Agreement with the Mexico Area Chamber of Commerce, the County of Audrain and Audrain Development Inc. to Assist in Economic Development Activities for the City of Mexico.

Mayor Miller called upon City Manager Slagle to provide the report.

Bill No. 2017 – 65 authorizes the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the Mexico Area Chamber of Commerce, the County of Audrain and the Audrain Development Inc. d/b/a Progress Mexico to assist in economic development activities in the City of Mexico for the budget year 2017 – 2018. Each entity will contribute the sum of Five Thousand and No/Dollars (\$5,000) for support in the cost of the economic development activities listed in the agreement. This is a renewal of an existing agreement with the cost and activities remaining the same. City Manager Slagle recommended Council proceed with reading and passage of Bill No. 2017 – 65.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for reading of Bill No. 2017 – 65. Council Member Loesch seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Bill No. 2017 – 65 was read in its entirety by Chairman Pro Tem Williams.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for passage of Bill No. 2017 – 65. Council Member Loesch seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Bill No. 2017 – 65 was passed as Resolution No. 3844.

Bill No. 2017 – 66. A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Enter Into An Agreement with the Mexico Senior Nutrition Center to Assist in Providing Services for Senior Citizens.

City Manager Slagle called upon Deputy City Manager Haynes to provide the report.

Bill No. 2017 – 66 authorizes the City Manager to enter into an agreement with the Mexico Senior Nutrition Center to assist in providing services to senior citizens. The 2017 – 2018 budget allows for the City of Mexico to contribute to the Mexico Senior Nutrition Center the sum of Fourteen Thousand and No/100Dollars (\$14,000.00) to assist in the offset of operational costs related to providing programs, activities and nutritional luncheon services. The City increased assistance to the Mexico Nutrition Center to \$14,000 last fiscal year and provided prior assistance in the amount of \$10,000 annually dating back to 2000. Deputy City Manager Haynes recommended that Council proceed with reading and passage of Bill No. 2017 – 66.

Ione Bickell, Executive Director of the Mexico Senior Center provided information on the center's programs and support and expressed appreciation to Council Members for their continued support of the center.

Council Member Nichols moved for reading of Bill No. 2017 – 66. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Bill No. 2017 – 66 was read in its entirety by Council Member Nichols.

Council Member Nichols moved for passage of Bill No. 2017 – 66. Council Member Shivers seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Bill No. 2017 – 66 was passed as Resolution No. 3845.

Bill No. 2017 – 67. A Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to Enter Into An Agreement with The Help Center to Offset Operational Costs Related to Providing Services to Citizens.

City Manager Slagle called upon Deputy City Manager Haynes to provide the report.

Bill No. 2017 – 67 authorizes the City Manager to enter into an agreement with The Help Center to assist in the offset of operational costs related to providing services to citizens. The 2017 – 2018 budget allows for the City of Mexico to contribute to The Help Center the sum of Five Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$5,000) for the use in the offset of operational costs related to providing programs, activities and services to citizens. The City provided assistance to The Help Center in 2004, 2009, 2010 and 2011 in the amount of \$5,000. In 2012, Council approved to increase the level of support to The Help Center to \$10,000 based on the need for additional assistance. Deputy City Manager Haynes recommended that Council proceed with reading and passage of Bill No. 2017 – 67.

Phil Iman, Executive Director of The Help Center provided an overview of the center's programs, operations and expressed appreciation to Council Members for their continued support of the center.

Council Member Shivers moved for reading of Bill No. 2017 – 67. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Bill No. 2017 – 67 was read in its entirety by Council Member Shivers.

Council Member Shivers moved for passage of Bill No. 2017 – 67. Council Member Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Bill No. 2017 – 67 was passed as Resolution No. 3846.

ORDINANCES (TWO READINGS BY TITLE ONLY AND PASSAGE)

Bill No. 2017 – 68. An Ordinance Calling for and Establishing the Filing Dates for the Municipal General Election to be held in 2018 to Fill Two Three-Year Terms on the Mexico, Missouri City Council.

Mayor Miller called upon City Manager Slagle to provide the report.

Bill No. 2017 – 68 sets the dates of the 2018 Municipal General Election, and establishes the time period for candidate filing. Statements of Candidacy will be received by the City Clerk from Tuesday, December 12, 2017 through Tuesday, January 16, 2018. The Municipal General Election date will then be held Tuesday, April 3, 2018. In order to proceed with the mechanics of accepting Statements of Candidacy and establishing the election dates, City Manager Slagle recommended Council proceed with two readings by title only and passage of Bill No. 2017 – 68, which had been posted the required length of time.

Council Member Loesch moved for first reading by title only of Bill No. 2017 – 68. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. First reading by title only was given to Bill No. 2017 – 68 by Council Member Loesch.

Council Member Loesch moved for second reading by title only of Bill No. 2017 – 68. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Second reading by title only was given to Bill No. 2017 – 68 by Council Member Loesch.

Council Member Loesch moved for passage of Bill No. 2017 – 68. Chairman Pro Tem Williams seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none. Bill No. 2017 – 68 was passed as Ordinance 4387.

OTHER BUSINESS

Staff Report – 2018 Dental Insurance Coverage

City Manager Slagle called upon Deputy City Manager Haynes to provide the report.

Staff reviewed group dental insurance bids for the upcoming benefit year January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2018. The City received four dental insurance quotes. The qualified proposals were received from Guardian; MetLife; Principal; and Standard. Giving full consideration to pricing submitted from providers, past service experience, benefit coverage, area network, percentage of UCR, MetLife provides the best overall dental plan for the upcoming plan year. Deputy City Manager Haynes recommended MetLife as the dental benefit provider for calendar year 2018 with the option to renew for two additional one year terms based on quality of service and acceptable renewal pricing. Gallaher Insurance Group was also recommended to be the agency of record based on the quality of service provided to the City of Mexico.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved to award the dental benefit package to MetLife and approve Gallaher Insurance Group as the agency of record. Council Member Shivers seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none.

Appointment to Various Boards and Commissions

Mayor Miller called upon City Manager Slagle to provide the report.

Appointments were needed for openings on the Enhanced Enterprise Zone Board, 21st Century Fund Inc., Mexico Airport Advisory Board, Mexico Tourism Commission; and Industrial Development Authority Board which need to be appointed by City Council.

Enhanced Enterprise Zone Board Michael Myers' term expired August 2017 and is interested in reappointment. Staff has not received any other applications expressing an interest in serving on this board. The term is 5 years, expiring August 2022.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved to reappoint Michael Myers to the Enhanced Enterprise Zone Board for a term of 5 year term expiring August 2022. Council Member Loesch seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none.

21st Century Fund, Inc. Tony Robertson and Martin Keller's terms expired August 2017. Mr. Keller is interested in reappointment. There are currently two openings and Staff has not received any other applications expressing an interest in serving on this board. The term is 3 years, expiring August 2020.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved to reappoint Martin Keller to the 21st Century Fund board for a term of 3 year term expiring August 2020. Council Member Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none.

Mexico Airport Advisory Board David Taylor and Steve Hagan's terms expired October 2017. Mr. Taylor is interested in reappointment and Mr. Hagan is not eligible for reappointment. Mr. Hagan has served the maximum consecutive terms. There are 3 openings on this board and Staff has not received

any other applications expressing an interest in serving on this board. The term is 3 years, expiring October 2020.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved to reappoint David Taylor to the Mexico Airport Advisory Board for a term of 3 year term expiring August 2020. Council Member Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none.

Mexico Tourism Commission Richard Gold was serving an unexpired term that expired September 2017. Mr. Gold is involved in the hotel/motel industry and is eligible for appointment for a full term. Mr. Gold has expressed an interest in serving on the Commission. Staff has not received any other applications expressing an interest in serving on this commission. The term is 3 years, expiring September 2020.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved to reappoint Richard Gold to the Mexico Tourism Commission for a term of 3 year term expiring August 2020. Council Member Loesch seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none.

Industrial Development Authority Board Kevin Freeman's term expired October 2021 and he has resigned his position on this board. Zach Templeton has expressed an interest in serving on this board. There are currently two openings on this board. The terms are 6 years, one term expiring October 2021 and another term expiring October 2022.

Council Member Shivers moved to reappoint Zach Templeton to the Industrial Development Authority Board for a term of 6 year term expiring October 2022. Council Member Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none.

Claims

Chairman Pro Tem Williams moved for approval of the list of claims as presented. Council Member Nichols seconded the motion. On a call by the Chair for ayes and nays, the motion carried, with the vote on passage as follows: Ayes, Miller, Williams, Shivers, Nichols, Loesch. Nays, none.

Chairman Pro Tem Williams commented on the facility opening of Presser Arts Center and upcoming community activities.

Council Member Shivers commented on the Unity Community Service that was held at the First Presbyterian Church. Council Member Shivers commented that she is continuing to work on diversity training for the City Council and City Staff.

Mayor Miller commented on the diversity training and asked that the training be provided at a Work Session for Council Member and Department Directors. Mayor Miller also commented on the City's newsletter, opening of Presser Arts Center and on the Unity Community Services that was held. Mayor Miller also commented on the Christmas Parade for floats and to contact the Mexico Chamber of Commerce for information.

The 2017 – 2018 annual budget allows \$20,000 for the purchase of one (1), full size, front wheel drive sedan for the Wastewater Division, with a trade-in of a 2003 Chevrolet Impala.

A Request for Bids was advertised in the *Mexico Ledger*, listed on the city’s website and was also sent to eight (8) vendors. Bids were received from Bob McCosh Chevrolet, Don Brown Chevrolet and Pearl Motor Company.

The City’s purchase policy provides for a 5% local preference allowance. Allowing for the local preference, Pearl Motor Company submitted the best bid.

Staff recommends Council approve the purchase of the 2018 Chevrolet Impala from Pearl Motor Company of Mexico, Missouri at a purchase price of \$21,323, subject to the dealer’s ability to deliver the vehicle in an acceptable length of time and the ability to meet all the bid specifications.
